RE: Consideration towards expiration of current emergency declaration status

- Borough of Dupont, Pennsylvania, Luzerne County
- EXPIRATION OF DECLARATION

The borough was under a state of emergency declaration that was originally issued on March 16, 2020, at 6:00 PM, due to the on-going COVID-19 situation.

This borough status has been extended several times, and has since expired on June 13, 2020.

A declaration as such should not extend beyond 90 days, as per Pennsylvania Emergency Management Guidelines.

The commonwealth of Pennsylvania, under the direction of governor Tom Wolf, has begun, and is in process, of moving specific counties into 'phases' of operation, with the health, safety, and COVID-19 status playing a critical part in each decision.

On May 29, 2020, Luzerne county has since moved from a 'red' to a 'yellow' phase status, meaning in short, many restrictions within a 'red' phase status, have been lifted as to allow more interaction within the county, and in turn, the borough of Dupont.

Luzerne county is following Pennsylvania state guidelines, and in turn forwarding results and status to local municipalities within the county as needed, including the borough of Dupont.

Given the results and actions by both county and state directives, the current county level phase status of 'YELLOW' shows only a POSITIVE movement towards the least restrictive phase of 'GREEN', hopefully in the near future.

The borough of Dupont HAS BEEN and IS continuing to follow guidance from county, state, and federal resources regarding control and operations during the COVID-19 situation, as to be part of a vital role within the commonwealth to ensure county movement towards a less restrictive phase of 'GREEN'.

A general awareness survey amongst area businesses and residents is showing the borough as a whole is aggressively doing its part to ensure the health and safety of everyone during this COVID-19 situation, and is expected to continue otherwise until additional guidance is received.

The borough of Dupont at this time does not foresee the need to maintain the local level emergency declared status beyond June 13, 2020, and may allow the current status to 'expire', without further action. In such a case, announcements of such actions will be advertised accordingly to inform the public. The municipality as a whole, including all residents and businesses, are aggressively adhering to state mandates and guidance as per the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Currently, there is no immediate requirement for borough officials to enforce guidance beyond what is currently received from the commonwealth.

In the event the expiration occurs with NO follow-up of a renewed declaration, **the CURRENT borough COVID-19 guideline status will be MAINTAINED**, and continued adherence of current county, state, and federal COVID-19 guidance will be maintained, AND ENFORCED.

Actions, such as reopening of public facilities and public interaction in general will still be guided by county, state and federal guidelines. The expiration of the LOCAL emergency declaration does NOT change the borough current status of ANY public facilities at this time, as restrictions will continue to be enforced. Announcements of any such access changes will be made accordingly, as the borough hopefully moves through the less restrictive phases of operation as per the commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

In reference to the current LOCAL status of the Borough of Dupont, the mayor of the Borough of Dupont is the governing official that provides the decision towards implementation of such declarations and status.

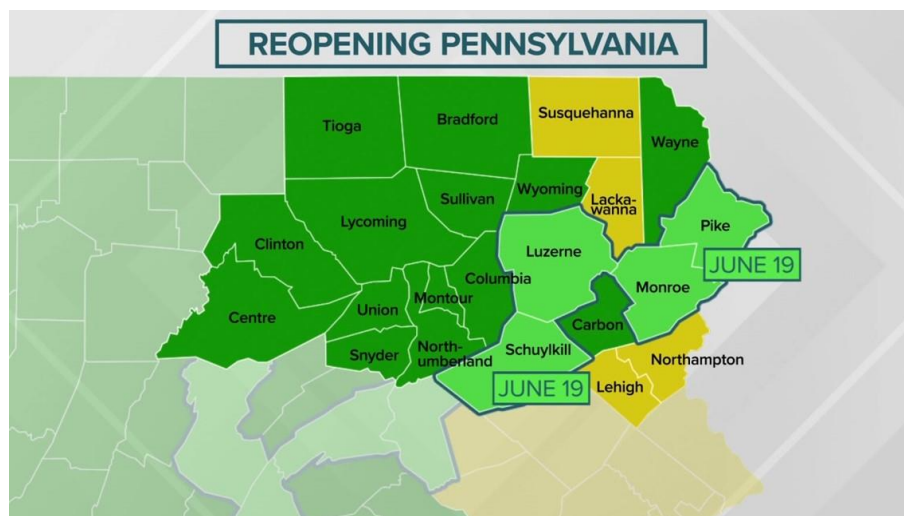
In the event another declaration of emergency is required, a special council meeting session will be advertised for the purpose, and actions executed as required. The public will be informed accordingly in the case of such an event occurs.

A courtesy call was made to the Luzerne County Emergency Management agency by borough emergency management, and briefly discussed was the current, and any possible changes, to local borough status.

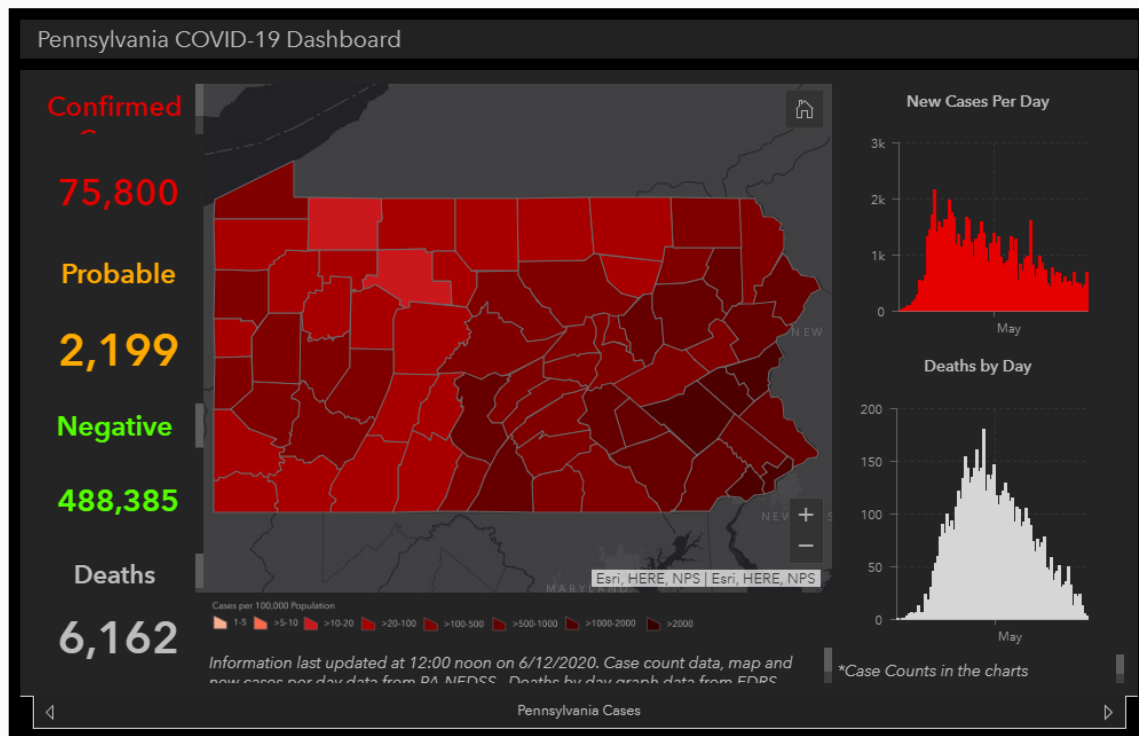

The county manager said that recovery made him question whether to sign a renewal of the state of emergency he declared March 15, after the state Health Department reported the first known case of coronavirus in the county.

(TNS) — Luzerne County will remain under a state of emergency for the rest of this week — but probably not much longer, county Manager David Pedri said Tuesday.

An emergency declaration expires after five days unless it is renewed, according to the county charter. Pedri, who as county manager is authorized by the charter to declare a state of emergency, has renewed the emergency declaration 17 times. The declaration in effect now expires Saturday.

[As calls mounted in the state Capitol for lawmakers to reform Pennsylvania's policing tactics and oversight, a Senate committee advanced a measure Monday to terminate the state's emergency declaration for COVID-19.](#)

Democrats further said that ending Pennsylvania's emergency declaration now would jeopardize the state's eligibility for federal relief funding.

Mastriano said he received personal assurances from the White House that the state would still qualify for federal relief funds if it terminated its emergency declaration.

But Democrats such as Sen. Lindsey Williams, D-Allegheny, said they would not vote for the measure until those assurances were in writing.

The resolution can now advance to the full Senate for a floor vote.

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In light of the Order of the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Health Directing Public Health Safety Measures for Businesses Permitted to Maintain In-person Operations effective April 19, 2020, 8:00PM, and to provide critical protections for the workers needed to run and operate the Borough of Dupont local government, a memo has been released stating all visitors to buildings maintained and operated by the Borough of Dupont local government must wear a face mask or face covering while on the premises or you will be denied entry and access.

Acceptable forms of face coverings, specifically covering the nose and mouth areas, include cloth coverings, scarfs, or bandanas.

Social distancing guidelines are also in affect within the public properties of the Borough of Dupont.
